
How we work

and will focus on offshore Wind, Blue & Green energy,

Wind, Blue & Green Energy

The purpose of the 5th Biennial technical visit on Wind, Blue & Green energy is to provide insight into offshore wind farms and the opportunities to become leader in renewable or alternative onorgy.

Program

The official opening ceremony will focus on the political and regulatory framowork of offshore renewables and its position in the European context and will be held on Wednesday evening in Ghent

Herman Van Rompuy, President em. of the European Council, and Bart Tommelein, Belgian State Secretary for the Nort Sea will speak to us

The second day will focuse on Offshore Wind. In the morning there will be technical presentations and in the afternoon the participants will have the possibility to visit an offshore wind farm in the North Sea, approximately 30 km off the Belgian coast . An alternative onchore tour in the barbour of Ostend will also be possible.

The Inst day will focuse on renewable energy specialisms such as energy storage, cable installation, energy recuperation on locks and research. The technical presentations will be followed by a tout in the harbour of Ghent.

On Saturday, there will be an optional post-BTV-technical visit.
